™ MANDATED PROGRAMS ™

Local and State funds assist in making our State mandated programs available *free of charge* to people who live or work in Windsor Locks and East Granby. State Law Sec. 10-73a requires that the adult education services described in this section be provided by local school districts, *free of charge*, to any adult 17 years of age or older who is not enrolled in a public elementary or secondary school program. A formal withdrawal letter is required for students 17 and 18 years of age. Our program focuses on College and Career Readiness.

You may also drop off your registration forms at the Adult Ed mailbox in the high school's main office during the day. If you do NOT receive notification, you may assume that your registration is complete, and your class will be held as scheduled.
